Coaching and NCCP Report

The 2025 season was another **strong year for coaching certification and development** across Prince Edward Island. With the addition of two new Learning Facilitators — **Connor Myers** and **Logan MacDougall** — joining **Desi Doyle** and **Randy Byrne**, Baseball PEI was able to expand clinic offerings across the province and improve accessibility for coaches in all regions.

Program Overview

The expanded facilitator team allowed for a greater number of clinics to be hosted throughout the year, including targeted development opportunities. Of particular note, an **October Planning Clinic** was introduced, aimed at supporting **female coaches** and others seeking to strengthen their seasonal planning and program design skills.

In addition, the traditional **February clinic series** continued successfully. These winter sessions typically focus on higher-level content for returning or advanced coaches preparing for the upcoming 2026 season.
